



2018 Inaugural Year of the Collegiate Preparatory Program!

Chair: Tiffany Coury

Collegiate Preparatory Program

This program is a grassroots effort to honor the United States Equestrian Core Values and carry its mission forward. It is designed for Junior riders who would like exposure to the collegiate level format within the Intercollegiate Horse Show Association. It is only open to Junior riders in good standing and only those who are enrolled in high school. Riders must submit an essay application to the committee chair prior to the first SNHSA-sanctioned event that they compete in that show season. The essay should be no more than 500 words and should be written on what the Core Values of the sport mean to them. Essays might be selected for publication in the SNHSA news.

Core Values: RIDE (Adopted from US Equestrian)

Respect: to honor and celebrate the love of horses and equestrian sport's traditions which unite SNHSA members of all breeds and disciplines.

Integrity: adherence to ethical principles that support the policies and procedures of the sport's governance.

Dedication: a commitment to formulating and implementing rules that ensure realistic and fair competitions at all levels.

Enterprise: to provide the enthusiasm and creativity to grow and advance equestrian sport and the determination and teamwork to face any challenges the future may hold.

Riders who are accepted into the program will complete three phases.

1. Collegiate Preparatory Horse Shows:

a. Rider will be eligible to participate in the "Collegiate Prep Classes" offered at SNHSA-sanctioned shows throughout the year. These classes will be "catch ride" format and must have at least two entries in order to proceed. Riders will enter his/her horse and each will draw for their new mounts. A horse bio must be completed at the show. There will be two options offered (flat or 2' over fences) and each will be judged separately.

2. Academic Standings:

a. Rider must maintain at least a 2.0 GPA throughout the current school year.

3. Horsemanship Exam:

a. Rider must complete and successfully pass (70%) a horsemanship exam that will be issued by the board.

All graduates will receive recognition at the Awards Banquet and special All-Academic Awards will be given to those riders who have successfully completed this program, maintaining a GPA of 3.5 or higher (on a 4-point scale) and are nominated by their coach or other representative within the equestrian community or school district. Nominations and grades must be submitted at the end of the school year.

2018 Inaugural Year of the Equestrian Sportsmanship Program

Equestrian Sportsmanship Program

This program is a grassroots effort to honor the United States Equestrian Sportsman's Charter and carry its mission forward. The program is open to Junior and Adult Amateur members in good standing. Riders must submit an essay application to the committee chair prior to the first SNHSA-sanctioned event of the show season year. The essay should be no more than 500 words and should be written on what the positive virtues of the sport mean to them. Essays might be selected for publication in the SNHSA news.

The Sportsman's Charter (Adopted from US Equestrian)

That sport is something done for the fun of doing it and that it ceases to be sport when it becomes a business only, something done for what there is in it;

That amateurism is something of the heart and spirit, not a matter of exact technical qualifications; That good manners of sport are fundamentally important;

That the code must be strictly upheld;

That the whole structure of the sport is not only preserved from the absurdity of undue importance, but is justified by a kind of romance which animates it, and by the positive virtues of courage, patience, good temper, and unselfishness which are demanded by the code;

That the exploitation of sport for profit alone kills the spirit and retains only the husk and semblance of the thing;

That the qualities of frankness, courage, and sincerity which mark the good sportsman in private life shall mark the discussions of his interests at a competition.

Riders who are accepted into the program will complete three phases.

- 1. Personal responsibility:
 - a. Rider must demonstrate a personal responsibility to continue growing in their knowledge of horse welfare and the sport itself as evidenced by attending at least two unmounted or combination clinics throughout the year. These clinics can either be SNHSA sanctioned or another, as long as it is approved by the board.
- 2. Serve local community:
 - a. Rider must volunteer at least 30 hours in return for sponsored clinic ride.
- 3. Horsemanship Exam:
 - a. Rider must complete and successfully pass (70%) a horsemanship exam that will be issued by the board.

Upon successful graduation of the program, riders will receive full sponsorship of an educational mounted clinic with a well-respected clinician. These clinics typically take place in December of every year and clinicians are selected for a two-year term.

All graduates will receive recognition at the Awards Banquet and one recipient will be awarded the SNHSA Equestrian Sportsmanship Program Award as selected by the board.

2018 Excellence in Equitation Awards

SNHSA promotes "Excellence in Equitation" by recognizing the accomplishments of riders competing at SNHSA-sanctioned equitation competitions. Awards are given to the top 10 junior and amateur riders based on cumulative competition-year points earned in SNHSA-sanctioned equitation divisions.

Riders must have USHJA/USEF active memberships to be eligible to participate in this program. Membership information must be provided to SNHSA prior to the end of the event for points to count. SNHSA three-venue and 10-point rules are applicable.

Congratulations to **Brogan Doolan** and **Leslie Biederman** for being the leading junior and adult amateur riders in this year's Excellence in Equitation Award program. As the USHJA/USEF member riders with the most points accrued in the SNHSA equitation divisions, they will each receive a one-year membership to EquestrianCoach.com.

2018 Inaugural Year of the **USHJA Affiliate Hunter Championships**

The USHJA Affiliate Hunter Championships saw horse-and-rider combinations that qualified through their USHJA affiliate member organizations compete at 2' and 2'6" fence heights. The inaugural event included riders from nearly every USHJA Zone who descended on the beautifully decorated South Point Arena & Equestrian Center.

SNHSA's top three point earners from the 2' and 2'6" divisions were invited to participate in the Championships and scholarships were offered to those chosen to go. Two riders from each fence height made the trek to Las Vegas and made the trip well worth it! All of our riders were in the ribbons in each of their respective divisions. Not only did they perform well, they also made us proud with their sportsmanship, horsemanship and camaraderie throughout. Most nights, our SNHSA members could be found in the barn aisles, walking their horses, or taking them outside for some fresh air and a roll after a job well done. They were at the back gate cheering each other on, setting fences, sharing equipment, and turning each individual ride into a team experience.

In addition to great competition, we had the opportunity to participate in free educational seminars, including a session with Sharon Classen, the physiotherapist for the 2018 U.S. Gold Medal World Equestrian Games Show Jumping Team; a Judging seminar, led by USEF R-rated judge and USHJA Certified Trainer Diane Carney; a course walk with USEF Youth Chef d'Equipe Di Ann Langer; as well as informational sessions with the official horse show farrier and official horse show veterinarian.

We also enjoyed the electric atmosphere of Las Vegas and the South Point Hotel, Casino & Spa, which houses the Equestrian Center, as well as a variety of vendors and shopping. The Las Vegas National CSI4* Longines FEI World Cup Qualifying class, as well as exhibitor hospitality, added to the overall National Championship experience.
